



What are SB* 12 & SB 965?

- **SB12 (Chapter 235, Statutes of 2005)**
 - Signed into State law at the 2005 Governor's Obesity Summit.
 - Strengthens the food standards in SB19 (Chapter 913, Statutes of 2001) and expands mandated compliance to all California public schools K-12.
 - Provides a detailed list of snack or à la carte item standards (Example: nuts are excluded from the fat requirements).
 - All food standards must be implemented in K-12 schools by July 1, 2007.

- **SB 965 (Chapter 237, Statutes of 2005)**
 - Passed in 2005, commencing July 1, 2007, no less than 50 percent of all beverages sold to a pupil from one-half hour before the start of the school day until one-half hour after the end of the school day at high schools shall be:
 - Fruit-based drinks that are composed of no less than 50 percent fruit juice and have no added sweetener.
 - Vegetable-based drinks that are composed of no less than 50 percent vegetable juice and have no added sweetener.
 - Drinking water with no added sweetener.
 - Two-percent-fat milk, one-percent-fat milk, nonfat milk, soy milk, rice milk, and other similar nondairy milk.
 - An electrolyte replacement beverage that contains no more than 42 grams of added sweetener per 20-ounce serving.
 - Starting July 1, 2009, all beverages sold to students from one-half hour before the start of the school day until one-half hour after the end of the school day at high schools shall be from the above listed.
